INTRODUCTION

In the rain of pamphlets issued by the War Department during the Second World War, one easily drowns. The living historian striving for an accurate impression, however, cannot do without the instructions aimed at the soldiers of those days. In this article an attempt is made to give an overview of Field Manuals and Technical Manuals issued to – an in many cases especially written for – the infantry.

The list given below is compiled from basic field manual FM 21-6 of January 1, 1943. This 145-page book gives an extensive overview of all distributed pamphlets of the War Department and to which organization the pamphlet was to be distributed. As no clearer description of the various publications can be given then in this manual itself, it will be cited here.

“ The primary texts for training in schools, including extension courses, in garrisons, in training centers, and in the field are War Department training publications issued, as a general rule, in the form of Field Service Regulations, Field Manuals, and Technical Manuals. Technical Regulations will eventually be eliminated by the inclusion of suitable material in other training documents.

a. *Field Service Regulations*, which are published as Field Manuals, constitute the basis of instruction of all arms and services in the operations of war and announce the basic doctrines which are expanded and applied in other texts. They contain the fundamental considerations concerning the employment of the combined arms and the combined services, and the strategical, tactical, and administrative employment of larger units and territorial commands.

b. *Field Manuals* constitute the primary means for expanding the basic doctrines of the Field Service Regulations. They are published in three general divisions as follows:

(1) The *Field Manuals for the several arms and services* contain instructions relative to the tactics and technique involved in the employment of such arm; and services, together with data needed in the theater of operations.

(2) The *Basic Field Manuals* contain training and reference data applicable to more than one arm or service, with special reference to the smaller units.

(3) The *Staff Officers' Field Manual* is a compilation of information and data to be used as a guide for the operations in the field of the general staff or a similar staff group of all units in peace and war.

c. *Technical Manuals* consist of a series of pamphlets supplementing the Field Manuals, covering subjects the separate treatment of which, is considered essential to a fuller accomplishment of the training prescribed in the Field Manual series. The scope of this series includes pamphlets describing matériel and containing instructions for the operation, care, and handling thereof; guidebooks for instructors and specialists; material for extension courses; reference books; and the like. ” (FM 21-6, War Department, 1943, pages 1 and 2)

LIST OF PUBLICATIONS

From the extensive tables of FM 21-6, only those manuals distributed to infantry organizations of regimental or lower headquarters are shown in this compilation. The list below thus summarizes the bulk of the military knowledge of the infantry regiments, battalions and companies.

The list is given in two tables, one for the Field Manuals and one for the Technical Manuals. The format is kept similar to the format of FM 21-6 for easy reference. The first column gives the number of the manual. For Field Manuals the letters FM should be added in front, whereas for Technical Manuals this is TM. The second column contains the original title of the manual and the third column the publication date. As numerous manuals underwent changes and revisions, this date is important to find the correct manual. Changes not yet processed in a new edition of the manual but officially published are given in the fourth column. Mostly as a numbered change (e.g. C1) but sometimes a Training Circular is mentioned. These were used to issue minor changes to the manuals.

The last column shows the distribution of the manual. The letter R stand for distribution to regimental headquarters, Bn for battalion headquarters and C for company headquarters. The letter I used in combination with the above letters indicates distribution to “interested organizations only.” The number indicates the number of copies furnished.

Both Field and Technical Manuals were originally written for a specific branch of the armed forces. Nevertheless, distribution of a manual was never restricted to this specific branch. Headers are used within the table to categorize the manuals in the same order the War Department did.
